Community Program Manager (CPM) Job Description

Once training is completed by the Training & Operations Director (T/O) and operational systems are mastered, this individual will provide a modified training workshop for building staff (6 hours), as well as work within the community to identify residents and building staff who might be key adopters.

This individual will then begin to supply the weekly usage statistics to the Grant Administration Director for inclusion in a weekly region-wide analysis.

Working with the Grant Administration Director, this individual will facilitate all of the “marketing” internal to the community (Building Resident Council, Town Hall Mtg, Key Resident Showcase with photos and memoirs) and external (Family night) to the neighborhood population that interact and visit with residents and family members.

During the Launch event, the CPM will be responsible for the layout of all marketing materials (balloons, tablecloths, food table, seating, photo taking, appointment cards, gift bags and prizes) and seek assistance from others as needed in order to ensure a top-tier showcase event. The CPM will coordinate the capture of information relative to the interest shown by the Launch attendees.

Working with the T/O, the CPM will complete a pre-eval survey form with all residents and schedule and complete their first (of 4) training session. In addition, the CPM will begin facilitating the Group Classes and Begin the Open Lab Workshops. Lastly, the CPM will set up profiles, lesson plans and goals for all residents.
