Update Community Anchor Institution (CAI) data layer - during the past quarter, DASC has been working to update and enhance the CAI data layer through the incorporation of existing geospatial data sets from the Kansas Adjutant General's Department and Kansas State Librarian. The Adjutant General's Department maintains a "structures" database with considerable overlap with the CAI features. This database is high-quality and up-to-date and will be used as an ongoing resource for maintenance of the CAI layer. Additionally, DASC received information from the state Librarian and is working to incorporate that information as well. A revised CAI layer will be included in the October, 2012 data submission. Research Advertised Upload/Download Speeds - during the past quarter, DASC searched available provider web sites to record advertised upload/download speeds. This information will be used as a cross-check against the current and incoming datasets. DASC plans to refresh this information atleast twice a year.

10bb. Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the project team is employing

DASC has streamlined the data collection process for Kansas providers by digitizing all hard copy data it received and creating provider-specific files for review one-on-one with Providers on-going, as able. Additionally, Adobe Connect meetings have proven valuable to help educate Providers on national methodology standards and best practices to increase participation as well as the accuracy of the data received.

10cc. Please provide any other information that you think would be useful to NTIA as it assesses your Broadband Mapping Project In support of ongoing communications and building stronger relationships with Kansas-based Broadband Providers, KSBI and DASC hosted a Provider Pilot Roundtable at the University of Kansas on May 17, 2012. Goals included validating direction and focus for a Provider Roundtable designed to streamline the Data Collection and Mapping process based on the subjective needs of Kansas Broadband Providers. Key Meeting Takeaways: • Much interest in better transparency regarding how data will be used.• Appetite exists to define "accuracy" and identify a plan to get there utilizing a phased-enhancements approach. Assurances needed that submission of accurate data will not de-position small providers in rural area. Desire for better definition of middle versus last mile infrastructure and responsibility. Call for standardization of reliable independent measures for speed and latency testing. Increase Uniformity in Reporting Attributes. Facilitate Accountability. In support of project management plan requirements, a Data Milestones Calendar was developed. Utilizing the calendar deliverables, numerous status sessions with DASC were conducted to identify additional value-added statistical reports and analysis to further support Legislative relationships and preparation of broadband coverage reports for regional energy projects, among other layer detail options including the State's CAI broadband presence. Key Calendar Elements: Project Reporting Broadband Service Provider Roundtables / Interaction with Industry Master List and ongoing service provider communication items • Data Collection – Planning / Service Provider Outreach / Web Portal – Provider Feedback Package /CAIs / Speed Tests • Data Submission Timeline – Data Validation. Cartographic Development and Data Submission • Establish Broadband Data and Interactive Planning Map including identification of strategic implications • Map Feedback / Correction Process / Site traffic analysis.

RTPTs: Project 17 – SE Sector Manufacturing Initiative: KSBI hosted two stakeholders planning sessions on April 30 to further refine and identify the types of resources needed to engage regionally-based Economic Development Councils in broadband planning and utilization practices designed to support business recruitment, relocation and expansion. Community Anchor Institution Workshops - "Broadband Everywhere" State Library System internet town hall meeting, August 22. Serve as technology-based economic development advisors for key audiences in attendance including Providers, the Governor's Office, all House and Senate candidates, mayors, municipals, state agencies and small businesses owners. Recruit regional stakeholders for subsequent planning meetings including first responders in support of Public Safety and First Net initiatives. "The Kansas Jubilee," eBay to eCommerce Conference, October 26-27, at Ft. Hays State University is a catalyst for starting and expanding businesses online and a natural fit for the KSBI program. Tutorials will provide instruction for rural communities and two unique partnership opportunities present themselves including the Ft. Hays hospital's telemedicine program - and healthcare applications for advanced (fiber) network deployment and utilization in the private sector - and The Kansas Small Business Development Center organization is head-quartered at Ft. Hays, with 17 affiliate sites statewide. KSBI will host the second annual Rural Opportunities Conference, November 7 – 8, in Junction City to promote programs and resources for technology-based economic development and an increased understanding of how the bi-annual mapping requirement is plotted, presented as well as implications for strategic planning and layer detail. Utilizing Broadband to deliver virtual job fairs on behalf of the private sector with an objective of job creation will be emphasized as well.

Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the project team is employing KSBI is eager to collaborate with external advertising and marketing agencies not only to formalize the existing Communications Plan but to deliver an on-site web presence that fully supports the vision and necessity of statewide broadband access and utilization. A custom website for the Kansas Statewide Broadband Initiatives program is underway and will support content for consumers, business entities, local municipalities and the Provider community at large. Dedicated support from the agency's Public Information Officer will add tremendous Media Relations value and reveal additional Kansas-based broadband success stories.

## **Additional Planning Information**

11j. Are there any additional project milestones or information that has not been included?

Uniform resources based on scientific data results will bring Regional Technology Planning Teams to fruition. Next steps for the RTPTs focus on the commission of custom-research to identify and confirm the types of resources community-based Economic Development Councils require to move forward with broadband utilization planning in support of business recruitment, retention and expansion in the context of Rural America. Confirmation of tool kit contents for broadband Utilization optimization, as well as Access tool kit contents for connectivity-challenged communities, will greatly increase the number of Kansas communities that fully embrace technology-based economic development solutions to realize the full potential, and necessity, of broadband services at the local level. Tool kits will be accompanied by instructor led Train-the-Trainer sessions for Economic Development Council members in market, online Training Manuals, assessments, surveys and measureable objectives for each RTPT and their subjective events and projects. The primary win for KSBI in Q212 was the commission of custom research, surveys and analysis to support over-arching program objectives, including a dedicated study of the State's KanEd agency that provides internet services for K-12 schools. Request for Proposals are due in August and the vendor will be selected and deployed before the end of Q313.

11k. Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the Project Team is employing The KSBI program office is positioned to fully develop and deploy category-specific programs now that staffing recommendations have been accepted. Current program developmental challenges include the need for private-sector expertise to graduate current resources into more functional, efficient and value-driven services that appropriately support KSBI's potential, as well as the expectations the State's Administration and the NTIA have for this program. Gaining buy-in and support from key stakeholders in the State's

Administration and the Department of Commerce to forge critical partnerships in the private sector to bridge the strategic divide have
peen met with great success. 11l. Please provide any other information that you think would be useful to NTIA as it assesses your Broadband Mapping Project
Pending State Match contributions include \$250,000 from the Kansas Legislature for the KanEd study. Match agreements with the Kansas Corporation Commission (state utility office) and the State Library System have been proposed via Memos of Understanding or each agency. Once feedback and refinements are received from KCC and the Library System the MOU content and inter-agency agreements can be formalized to facilitate quarterly ARRA and NTIA reporting requirements.
