The application includes a staging environment for data verification and compatibility as well as a production environment for client access.									
Consumer feedback in the form of broadband inquiries is also collected. These inquiries represent any type of communications received from the public regarding broadband service. Once broadband inquiries are received across the state, this information is overlaid with the broadband availability information which was collected through the State Broadband Initiative (SBI) program. This allows for a real-world comparison of the broadband landscape to the information received from broadband inquiries. Broadband inquiries are able to provide three types of information: 1) residents who do not have broadband but want it; 2) residents who have broadband but want a different provider; and 3) residents who do not have broadband, but the broadband inventory maps indicate that they do. The Puerto Rico broadband semi-annual dataset update was successfully submitted. The data update submission included datasets for 84 percent of the Puerto Rico provider community, or 16 of 19 total providers. There are 15 participating providers and 1 additional non-participating provider whose estimated coverage areas have been submitted. Of the 15 participating providers, 11 supplied an update to their network or coverage areas, while 3 reported no change. The remaining provider previously supplied data, but was non-responsive in this update effort; therefore its previous dataset was put forward as part of the update.

Our mapping vendor, Connect Puerto Rico, worked in close coordination with the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) gathering data on the location and broadband connectivity of Community Anchor Institutions (CAI), in accordance with the data requirements of the SBI Notice of Funds Availability (NOFA) Technical Appendix. Efforts have been focused on conducting outreach and raising awareness through a statewide campaign and through existing relationships and those developed through the Puerto Rico Broadband Task Force. Outreach has involved working closely with key members of the Puerto Rico Health Information Network, the Department of Education, and Department of Public Housing to obtain data already collected on the island.

This project has an ongoing mission to educate CAI throughout the commonwealth on the importance of participating in the project. We continue to utilize an online survey in both Spanish and English and raise awareness of the importance of CAI broadband connectivity.

As of Q1 2012 our matching contribution remains 17%, just under the requirement. During Q1 2012, the Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority GIS data sets and the Puerto Rico Water & Sewer Authority GIS data sets have been made available to Connect Puerto Rico....

10bb. Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the project team is employing A continued challenge exists to educate CAI about SBI and the intent of gathering connectivity information. This obstacle is easily avoided when we engage sector leaders and ask them to distribute the survey on our behalf, which supports the validity of the survey. Across the board, the response is significantly higher when the survey is distributed by a sector leader or organization. Therefore, it has become obvious that a focused sector approach is most successful as well as clearly engaging the state client to help identify sector leaders and organizations. Ahead of the October 2012 reporting, Puerto Rico is focusing on one sector per month (and two for one month) to better direct attention toward specific sectors.

Additionally, CAI address information oftentimes does not translate to geocoded data. Strategies to overcome this challenge include contacting the CAI directly to clarify location and engaging the OCIO GIS Manager to interpret addressing information through local area knowledge and cross-referencing datasets made available through in-kind contributions.

10cc. Please provide any other information that you think would be useful to NTIA as it assesses your Broadband Mapping Project Connect Puerto Rico released the USF Mobility Fund Eligibility Maps & Analysis, a report detailing the FCC's preliminary list of areas in Puerto Rico that are eligible for the FCC's Mobility Fund. On February 10, 2012, the FCC released a list of areas in Puerto Rico census blocks that it had determined do not currently have access to 3G mobile wireless service. The FCC generated this preliminary list from its review of commercial, industry data sources. 11. Broadband Planning

11a. Please describe progress made against all goals, objectives, and milestones detailed in the approved Project Plan. Be sure to include a description of each major activity / milestone that you plan to complete and your current status

Our vendor, Connect Puerto Rico, serves in a supporting capacity to the Puerto Rico Broadband Taskforce (PRBT), whose goal is to author a Strategic Broadband Plan for Puerto Rico that will provide a blueprint to help bridge the digital gap across the island. In that capacity, multiple deliverables were provided to the PRBT such as working products geared towards the completion of the Strategic Plan, including Strategic Plan outlines and other guidance documents. Furthermore, Connect Puerto Rico supports the PRBT by informing on broadband issues as they relate to Puerto Rico.

Several PRBT meetings took place during Q1 2012 to advance the progress of the Puerto Rico Strategic Broadband Plan. Connect Puerto Rico provided data regarding Puerto Rico's residential technology adoption, online applications utilized by Puerto Rico residents, drivers of the digital divide, and barriers to technology adoption, as well as technology adoption among Puerto Rico's industry sectors. Additionally, a program developed graphical representation of data, as well as presentation design. Content and feedback from stakeholders have been incorporated into individual chapters and have begun an editing and formatting process for compilation into a single comprehensive plan. During the quarter, the PRBT revised the estimated completion date of the Strategic Broadband Plan to the beginning of Q2 2012.

Milestone: Analysis of Residential and Non-Adopter Technology Assessments

This milestone is in the process of being completed. In Q4 2011, program vendor Connected Nation (CN) contracted with a local Puerto Rico business establishment (Estudios Tecnicos, Inc.) to conduct the Residential Technology Assessment and non-adopter telephone surveys.

11b. Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the project team is employing Due to input required by the many sectors of the PRBT, the initial completion timeline for the Broadband Strategic Plan was not met. Much work and feedback has been incorporated into the plan and the PRBT has set a new completion date of Q2 2012.

Full analysis of the 2012 Residential and Non-Adopter Technology Assessments were unable to be completed before the end of Q1 2012. At this time, analysis of the Non-Adopter survey is in process and Estudios Tecnicos is in the process of conducting the Residential survey. Full analyses and a public release of Residential and Non-Adopter surveys are anticipated to be completed in Q2 2012.

11j. Are there any additional project milestones or information that has not been included?

Project staff delivered a presentation to the Puerto Rico Broadband Task Force on the USF Mobility Fund and its impact to Puerto Rico. The presentation compared the FCC eligible areas list to the geographic areas on Puerto Rico's broadband maps that have access to mobile download speeds of 1.5Mbps. For the most part, the data confirms that the vast majority of the areas of Puerto Rico lacking 3G technology do not, in fact, have adequate mobile broadband service. However, it also appears that many parts of Puerto Rico that do not have access to high-speed mobile broadband service are not on the FCC's list of eligible areas.

Connect Puerto Rico also convened a stakeholder meeting to discuss the opportunities framed within the FCC's upcoming Lifeline Program Reform Order via adoption stimulation pilot programs. The order creates a pilot program to be implemented in 2012 to test different models and expand the program to broadband. The order also seeks comments on funding digital literacy programs at schools and libraries. Connect Puerto Rico believes it is important for Puerto Rico to be represented in the pilot programs and it can help change lives and communities across the island through the widespread emphasis on broadband.

11k. Please describe any challenge or obstacle that you have encountered and detail the mitigation strategies the Project Team is employing

No additional challenges or obstacles were encountered during Q1 2012.

11l. Please provide any other information that you think would be useful to NTIA as it assesses your Broadband Mapping Project A significant amount of energy and effort has been directed towards the development of the Strategic Broadband Plan. The Puerto Rico Broadband Task Force is developing the plan with comprehensive multi-sector input and feedback. The Connect Puerto Rico team is assisting in producing this in-depth assessment of Puerto Rico's broadband ecosystem by working with numerous stakeholders, representing various sectors within the commonwealth community. The plan is covering several areas including: Accelerating Broadband Investment, The Puerto Rico Broadband Landscape, Broadband Infrastructure, Education, E-Health, and Stimulating Broadband Adoption.

A newly redesigned and fully interactive Connect Puerto Rico website launched during Q1 2012 in an effort to make the interactive tools more easily accessible by the public and to more effectively communicate Connect Puerto Rico's mission of changing lives and communities across Puerto Rico through the widespread use of technology, especially widespread access, use, and adoption of broadband. The website had 844 unique visitors during Q1 2012 with 7,591 page views.

Along with the redesigned website, the program continues to implement traditional and new media strategies to engage and inform

citizens about broadband opportunities and options for underserved communities in the commonwealth. During the quarter,11 blog
posts were issued and 65 updates/tweets were published to the Connect Puerto Rico Facebook and Twitter accounts. Additionally, the
