Note: Qwest SONET pricing is based upon 3 year termination and does not include NRC for optical termination. There are a few examples of entrepreneurial 'specialty' builds in the region, but these solutions are still limited by a high cost of entry for a dedicated entity without true regional impact with legacy type speeds. Finally, these solutions are not scalable for capacity and do not contain a sustainable business model. Pricing is unavailable for these solutions for capacity, NRC and MRC. The network in this grant is open. Current regional entreprenurual providers and existing regional last-mile providers, can leverage upon the infrastructure provided in the grant.
