We are writing to express our support for Contact Network, Inc. //Dba InLine Communication's BTOP program to provide broadband access into areas served by our library system.

We are a 20 branch public library system, operating in 4 counties in Central Mississippi. Some of our branches are in very rural areas, without access to broadband internet. Other libraries are in areas where broadband is available, but it is expensive and is priced out of our range.

Without access to more available and more affordable broadband, patrons in those libraries without broadband find it difficult to use the internet to search for jobs, use tutorials to improve computer skills, use e-government websites, or find materials for homework, among other tasks.

With broadband internet available, our patrons would be able to use our public access computers to do these tasks and more at all libraries and not just at libraries in areas with available and affordable broadband and internet access.

Dear Mr. Costa:

I would like to thank InLine for its efforts toward providing additional broadband service to the schools, other entities and citizens of Columbia and Marion County, Mississippi.

Each year we encounter more and more educational content being delivered across our digital networks especially across the Internet. With each addition of this content to our curriculum, we find the requirement for bandwidth at all levels to be increasing proportionately. Our current broadband solutions are both limited and expensive. With the current budget crises as well as budget projections for the foreseeable future, we would be prohibited from exercising the available options and increasing our bandwidth both to the internet and between buildings.

The reliability of a fiber network and the increased bandwidth at the prices you are projecting are things we could use to great advantage both functionally as well as financially. Financially, for example, a 1Gb network connection between buildings would allow our district to completely centralize our servers at a single location, significantly reducing costs for multiple servers as well as reducing costs of electricity for cooling. Our current options for acquiring such connections are prohibitively expensive, even with the cost-savings factored in.

Your efforts toward providing an alternative broadband solution for the citizens of Columbia and Marion County will also be beneficial to the Columbia School District. Many of our students live in an area not currently served by DSL connections. Because of this, our teachers are limited in the assignments they can make for students to utilize the vast resources of the Internet for homework and out-of-class projects. We are limited in the content we can provide for home access as well. Videos of classes missed by students have been considered but cannot be implemented until we have sufficient bandwidth to the Internet from the school and parents have adequate broadband access from home.

We appreciate your efforts, and our district is very interested in moving forward with you to increase broadband access throughout Marion County in order to enhance our students' achievement and give broadband access to the citizens of Marion County.

Thanks for the efforts of Contact Network, dba InLine, to provide increased broadband service to our school district and the other entities and citizens of Lawrence County. Living in a digital age requires that we provide education differently than we ever have before. This includes the need for increased bandwidth to support applications like video conferencing and digital content, as well as providing access to the internet for our students and parents at home.

Currently our broadband service at the schools is inadequate for applications such as video conferencing and digital content. In addition, most of our students/parents do not have broadband available at their homes, so connecting to the internet or back to the school after hours is not a possibility. Currently, it is not practical to assign internet based homework, or even communicate with the parents.

We need increased bandwidth and the reliability that a fiber network will provide at our schools. Though increased bandwidth is available at some sites from our current provider(s), we cannot afford the increase in price. The prices you are proposing that your company can provide would allow us to increase our bandwidth to 1 GB at each location at a significant discount. The current budget crisis as well as budget projections for the foreseeable future prohibit us from exercising the available options and increasing our bandwidth both to the Internet and between buildings.

The reliability of a fiber network and the increased bandwidth at the prices you are projecting is something that we could use to great advantage both functionally as well as financially. Financially, for example, a 1Gb network connection between buildings would allow our district to completely centralize our servers at a single location, significantly reducing costs for multiple servers in the district. To whom this may concern;

As the Director of the Pine Forest Regional Library system I would like to express my interest in obtaining help from the BTOP program for increasing Broadband Access for our local service areas. Our system is made up of four counties; Covington, Greene, Perry, and Stone. We have an ongoing project in Stone County for help with increasing our computer servixces and access down there. However, due to regional areas of interests this project cannot be used in our other three counties.

At this point we have nine libraries of varying size, most in very small communities. Of those nine, five still have 56K access as we cannot afford to go to a T1 for them. The other four branches are at T1 level. Our system cannot afford to go for any higher connectivity at this time, nor in the foreseeable future, without receiving some sort of assistance. Our public access computers therefore have a slow speed, and in some cases, take way too long to access web pages and/or print. Since we only have a few machines available to the public, the longer one person takes, the more another has to wait or come back at another time.

In the last year we have partnered with the WIN Job centers in the state to enable people to search for jobs locally instead of driving to the offices in Hattiesburg, Laurel or Gulfport. Once they are registered with WIN, they can search for jobs and be given credit at the local library. Plus we provide job searching skills, employment outlooks, and even out of state opportunities. This service has created a greater demand for our computer usage, coupled with the increase in online class taking, and often users face the problems inherit in our rather dated and slow system.

In the smaller communities in our service area we are often the only location for free internet access in the community. And some residents that have computers cannot get, or afford, internet service. I am of the opinion that this project by Contact Network would greatly enhance our operating abilities, allow us to better serve those residents in our service area, improve our ability to help those in the community needing internet access, allow us to be of greater assistance in local education, and of course, thru continued efforts to help our local people find jobs.

In terms of statistics, as of last year we had over 70,000 patrons in our various facilities, over 23,000 patrons used our computer services, while another 8,000 plus took classes or training online. Currently we pay \$1,344 a month for internet in Covington County, two T1 and one 56k; \$1,109 a month for Greene County, one T1 and two 56k; and \$1,200 for Perry County, one T1 and two 56k.

At this time we would appreciate any consideration that could be given to allow us to become part of this program in order to better serve our patrons, and the local community at large. If I can answer any questions or supply other information, please let me know,

Please find the following reasons I support InLine in their efforts to gain a BTOP grant. S-RESA provides professional development to mostly 30 school districts in South Central Mississippi, but we do training for districts all over the state. One of the major technologies some of the school districts have invested heavily in is video conferencing. Through some USDA RUS grants and the use of Erate funding, S-RESA helped place well over 100 video conferencing systems in schools throughout South Central Mississippi. In addition, S-RESA purchased a MCU, through the Erate program, to allow our districts to seamlessly make calls and conduct classes from district to district. At this point, our biggest concern is bandwidth. Our districts do not have adequate bandwidth to do video conferencing along with their other applications. So, the equipment many worked so hard to get is underutilized. We recognize the huge need to share teacher resources between schools and between districts. And, we would like to be able to offer professional development via video conferencing. However, in many schools there is not sufficient band width between sites for this to be possible. We would even like to pursue other grants and opportunities to expand the number of video conferencing units we have, because we know there is funding available and there is a need. Thanks for the efforts of Contact Network, dba InLine, to provide broadband service to our school district and the other entities and citizens of Walthall County. Living in a digital age requires that we provide education differently than we ever have before. This includes the need for increased bandwidth to support applications like video conferencing and digital content, as well as providing access to the Internet for our students and parents at home.

Most of our students/parents do not have broadband available at their homes, so connecting to the Internet or back to the school after hours is not a possibility. Currently, it is not practical to assign Internet based homework, or even communicate with the parents.

We need increased bandwidth at a lower cost and the reliability that a fiber network will provide at our schools. Though increased bandwidth is available at our sites from our current provider(s), we cannot afford the increase in price. The prices you are proposing that your company can provide would allow us to increase our bandwidth to 1Gb at each location at a significant discount. 
The Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians, the only Federally-recognized American Indian population in the State of Mississippi, understands and appreciates the high value of making broadband services available to all 10,000 enrolled of which are 6200 Tribal residents within 8 communities who are living primarily in east central Mississippi. Our Tribe is very progressive, constantly working toward higher levels of educational attainment, a major participant in economic development on the Choctaw Indian Reservation, as well as in business sites off-Reservation, and the provider of a multitude of Tribal governmental services ranging from healthcare, housing, and education, to law enforcement, judicial services, and homeland security and emergency management, among many additional services. We are keen on ensuring the provision of reliable and easily accessible, inexpensive broadband services to the entire Choctaw population that our government serves. We have a broad range of Tribal schools, healthcare facilities, court system, social services, rehabilitation, early childhood education, gaming and hospitality industries, legal services, rural and agricultural development, and other Tribal governmental and business operations that rely on fast internet connectivity on a daily basis.

The Tribe intends to plan and develop our own grant application in order to provide increased broadband services to all Choctaw residents, Tribal Council and staff, administrative governmental offices, all Tribal School System locations, as well as to all Choctaw business enterprises. The Tribe has 35,000 acres of land, most of which is held in perpetual Federal trust for the benefit of the Tribe as a whole. These vast land holdings are geographically scattered in a checkerboard fashion, and are situated in ten different Mississippi counties. We have eight Federally-recognized Choctaw communities in Mississippi, with our largest community and site of Tribal government headquarters being located centrally in Neshoba County. One of our communities, Bogue Homa, is located 100 miles south in Jones County, Mississippi. 

Delivering quality, timely and affordable healthcare to our patients has always been a goal of Forrest General Hospital. A big part of that challenge is supporting the physicians and staff at the various clinics and hospitals located throughout our service area, whether they be entities owned by Forrest General or not. Once obstacle that typically presents itself when we look at providing services to these facilities is the bandwidth available to transmit electronic media, whether that be diagnostic information, medical records, or some type of teleconferencing.

Currently we do have connectivity to all facilities that FGH owns, but at some locations we are limited to older technologies such as Frame Relay. DSL and Cable are not available in some of the service areas that we support. Due to those limitations, things such as radiology image transfer are very difficult to perform timely. The few locations that we do have Metro-E solutions provided by ITC Deltacom, the cost is quite substantial, which makes it financially not a good solution for the other areas that we really need private network connectivity in. With the ever changing mandates under HIPAA, utilizing the internet for transfer of patient specific information is almost a risk. Even with the proper VPN and encryption techniques, one still doesn't have total control of their information once it arrives on the World Wide Web.

We would be very interested in looking at options offered by Contact Network, if they became available in our areas of need.

Hattiesburg Clinic has satellite facilities located all over south Mississippi. While most of these facilities are connected via Metro Ethernet, that service is not available for all. Where Metro is not available, older technologies are in use, such as Frame Relay. Were additional broadband options available, Hattiesburg Clinic would be able to take advantage of those offerings in several ways.

- 1. The use of Electronic Health Records by all healthcare providers is being strongly encouraged as part of ARRA. While Hattiesburg Clinic does possess an EHR, increased availability of broadband services would allow us to expand and enhance the use of the EHR at our remote facilities.
- Expanded availability of broadband services would provide Hattiesburg Clinic with redundant
 options for our remote facilities. Currently, with only a single point of communication, when there
