We believe there is enough time in our schedule to make up delays from 2011 in 2012 by providing more construction resources. We will also be constructing in Mandan, Bismarck and Fargo simultaneously rather than sequentially like we originally planned on cable construction. Grand Forks will overlap with Fargo also. These two factors will keep us on schedule this summer. Progress is ahead of schedule but bill from sub-recipients are lagging behind.

DCN is confident we will finish well ahead of the third year deadline. We have resources working and should have spent approximately 67% of funds by July 31, 2012. Miles deployed is estimated to be 54% of miles by July 31, 2012. This is due to the fact that the majority of construction dollars and work is in city limits and you cannot achieve 67% of the miles with 70% of the dollars. Equipment, engineering and right-of-way will be at least 85% complete by July 31, 2012. By end of 2012 we expect to be 87% overall and 82% of miles deployed.
