These connections consist of public safety entities, schools (k-12), Institutions of higher education, community colleges, community support organizations, government facilities, and medical facilities. Two hundred and sixty four miles of fiber have been installed collectively in the cities of Centerville, Orem, Layton, Midvale, West Valley and Murray. The network design, construction, testing and installations have been completed for the project.
