Since the grant award in late September 2010, the Puget Sound Center for Teaching, Learning and Technology has focused its efforts on hiring and establishing a project management team, working with the Public Computer Centers (PCC) to confirm project budgets, user targets and hours, and developing Memorandums Of Understanding (MOU) to govern the work with the subrecipients. From those experiences we have learned that:

- a) The award regulations and requirements that filter down to subrecipients can be complex, and at times, overwhelming, for some of the smaller Public Computer Centers. It helps to have a compliance expert on the project management team, to provide clear, detailed explanations, as well as tools, templates and federal resources for the subrecipients.
- b) Hosting webinars, to communicate and educate subrecipients about various aspects of the grant award is useful, but it needs to be supplemented by office hours shortly afterward, to answer individual questions and reiterate messages.
