ABOUT THE PROJECT

Alaska and its rural communities often lack crucial broadband-enabled services like distance learning, public safety, and telehealth. The University of Alaska Fairbanks, spearheading the Alaska Distance Education Consortium, proposes to promote broadband adoption across the state by delivering relevant content and services, driven largely by online learning for professional development, to remote villages including dozens of Native Alaskan villages that are most in need of improved service and adoption levels. The project also plans to train "Village Internet Agents" to respond to the hardware and software needs of residents.

The Bridging the e-Skills Gap project also proposes to:

- Provide computer skills and broadband training to as many as 7,400 residents over the life of the project. offering approximately 89,000 training hours focusing on online connectivity, career building, community resources, and education.
- Leverage public computer centers and provide over 600 mobile computers linked to the project portal for loan to residents.
- Engage 21 project partners comprising the Digital Inclusion Council, along with local telecommunications providers, to identify clusters of participants that should receive introductory discounted broadband rates. These clusters could include teachers, healthcare providers, or public safety entities.

ORGANIZATION'S HISTORY

The University of Alaska Office of Information Technology (OIT) is composed of staff from the University of Alaska Fairbanks and statewide University of Alaska staff. OIT provides university consumers with technology, tools and resources to support and enhance learning, research and outreach for Alaskans. The managing partner on this project, the Alaska Distance Education Consortium, is housed within OIT and has managed funding for distance learning in Alaska for over 10 years.
