As a result of our BTOP site visit in October, we have learned that in order to remain compliant with the final award agreement, it was necessary to make a few changes.

Although construction is not scheduled to begin until the first quarter of 2012, it was necessary to increase the rate in which we were reaching out to community anchors. By doing that, we quickly became aware that there might be changes to the list proposed originally, and determined through the overlap process, based on many different factors including economic conditions, market competition from other providers, changes in location due to tropical storm Irene, etc.

VTel also needed to adopt and document procedures to adequately comply with the financial management guidelines for the BTOP project. Processes are in place to identify allowable costs, however the policies needed to be clearly outlined, to ensure that BTOP guidelines are being followed.

The last performance improvement plan that was identified concerned identifying that all BTOP terms and conditions be included in any contracts entered into during the NTIA grant period. We have made corrections to all existing contracts, and any new contracts are being reviewed by VTel's attorneys to make sure that they include all the necessary terms and conditions required.

Several CAI's listed on the attached "Annual PPR CCI Addendum" have been stricken at the request of NTIA. Our understanding is that another BTOP funded project has included these and despite Vtel having built fiber prior to BTOP, these CAI's remain in the other BTOP project's scope. While VTel will not expend any grant funds to overbuild the fiber we've already placed, VTeI's grant is also upgrading our network's overall speed and capacity. These pre-existing customers will receive improved service from VTeI if they choose to remain our customers.
