EA: Since our award date of 08/18/2010, Peoples Telephone Cooperative has contracted with an engineering firm named CHR Solutions to perform our environmental assessment and they are progressing steadily. CHR anticipates that the EA will be completed by the end of January, 2011.

Construction: Our in-house engineering staff has been working with CHR and Mitchell Engineering (ME) to develop the detailed plan for Phase 1 from the larger application design. They have driven the selected route(s) to identify construction issues and located potential building sites for pre-fabricated buildings to house electronics.

Federal Expenditures: To the end of Q1Peoples Telephone has spent a total of \$112,553.24 for the Environmental Assessment and Engineering Services. We have not yet sought reimbursement for this money but anticipate that we will draw these funds down either Q2 or Q3 of the project.

EA: It is anticipated that CHR will have the draft EA submitted for review by the end of Q2.

Construction: In order to help control costs, Peoples Telephone plans to purchase and supply the fiber cable. It is anticipated that specifications will be sent out for bid on the fiber by the end of Q2 with purchases starting Q3. A key component of our strategy will be timely delivery of the fiber directly to the contractor thereby reducing handling damage, vandalism and storage costs. CHR and ME will be field staking and pursuing the necessary highway permits for February construction.

Federal Expenditures: We expect Federal Expenditures in Q2 to be \$740,224 primarily for engineering and Environmental Assessment.
