ENMR•Plateau was notified of Round 2 stimulus grant funds on August 20<sup>th</sup> and accepted the award on September 15<sup>th</sup>.

An RFP was created for Engineering consulting services and sent to three firms on September 8<sup>th</sup>; bid responses were received and ENMR•Plateau awarded the Engineering consulting services contract on September 29<sup>th</sup> based on the company's procurement guidelines.

No federal expenditures incurred during the first quarter of the project.

The OSP (outside plant) project design is under way. Currently the Engineering consulting group is confirming fiber construction routes and anchor locations that were provided in the application. The DWDM (dense-wave division multiplexing) network design is expected to begin this quarter. The DWDM RFP is being finalized and is expected to be sent out to bid during this quarter along with the DWDM RFP for ENMR•Plateau's Round 1 project. ENMR•Plateau will not expense any funds or enter into any contract related to the DWDM equipment for Round 2 until the Environmental Assessment is complete and the FONSI is issued.

An RFP was created for the Environmental consulting services and sent to four firms on October 8<sup>th</sup>; bid responses were received and will be evaluated and awarded based on ENMR•Plateau's procurement guidelines. Once the Environmental consulting group has been awarded the contract they will be able to begin work on the Environmental Assessment for the project. The Environmental Assessment for ENMR•Plateau's Round 2 project is due February 1<sup>st</sup>. ENMR•Plateau has been diligently working with the BTOP Environmental team in the preparation of the Environmental Assessment. We are expecting the draft Environmental Assessment to be approximately 95% complete by the end of this quarter. Once the Environmental Assessment is complete and the FONSI is issued we will begin work on obtaining rights of way and construction permits.

During the second quarter, ENMR-Plateau expects to incur expenses related to engineering and environmental consulting work completed for the project. We have projected to expense approximately \$225,000.00 for these services in this second quarter. ENMR•Plateau will not request a draw down on grant funds until the FONSI has been issued for the project.
