Project Indicators (This Quarter)

1. Please describe significant project accomplishments completed during this quarter (600 words or less).

Iowa Health Des Moines (IH-DM) and Guthrie County Hospital (GCH) are discussing the installation of base equipment regarding specific end points that both IH-DM and GCH will pursue through October. A strategy will be put in place to plan for neighboring, registration and address blocks and the continuation of installing the telemedicine equipment and testing for issues are major activities. Greene County Medical Center (GCMC) Executed three contracts this guarter with CAI targets. Equipment was deployed in two of the three sites and additional staff training is being planned with each of these CAI's. GCMC continue to test, order and install equipment as well. GCMC also secured a nurse presenter for the program that will begin working in the program during the next quarter. GCMC specific outreach activities included: 1) Presentation to three person surgical group and three additional clinical staff; 2) Presentation to eastern lowa physician consortium (8 people); 3) Prepared and submitted a proposal to the governor's office relating to our placement of equipment with Homeland Security and it's network; 4) Grant Administrator took part in ATA Annual Fall Forum via simulcast; 5) Met with the City Council of Jefferson to discuss our agreement and equipment configuration (15 People); 6) Conducted a telemedicine presentation for McFarland Clinic physicians at our facility (5 people); 7) Hosted and transmitted an educational session from our hospital meeting room to an additional room, to allow additional employees to access the presentation, and also coordinated the recording of this presentation with Clarke County for future usage (54 people were in attendance); 8) Telehealth presentation to Multidisciplinary Team during their meeting and presentation to emergency response personnel from Greene County for a "September 11th Anniversary" celebration to honor them (28 people); 9) Video conference with Jeff Kennedy, Project Manager Consultant with Iowa Health System to discuss the overall global technical structure for the telehealth initiatives that are underway through the BTOP grant. 10) Four nurses on staff at GCMC trained on utilization of 3M Littmann Stethoscopes (4 people); 11) Telehealth Presentation to Public Health staff (7 people); 12) Prepared press release and photos for story in the local newspaper regarding the BTOP telehealth initiative. Grundy County Memorial Hospital (GCMH) focused heavily on outreach and planning activities with their local school systems. Meetings were held with school administrators from five school districts to discuss the opportunities to utilize the equipment to enhance educational services in the area. GCMH successfully deployed equipment to four of the eight school systems in the area (Gladbrook-Reinbeck, Aplington-Parkersburg, Grundy Center, and Dike-New Hartford). Within the four school systems, GCMH implemented equipment at eight individual school buildings in various communities spanning a 21mile radius around the hospital. The GCMH Telehealth Manager held two public outreach sessions in the quarter to raise community awareness of the project. Approximately 245 community members were educated about the hospital's telemedicine project. A significant amount of effort was devoted in the quarter to working with the Allen Hospital Emergency Department staff to plan and prepare for implementing the technology in the GCMH and Allen Emergency Departments to facilitate the patient transfer process. This work involved testing and researching equipment options, identifying processes, developing documentation, and conducting extensive training of staff and providers. Additionally, a Telehealth Nurse was hired, which is a new position created through the BTOP grant. Clarke County Hospital (CCH) continues to support demonstrations, needs assessments, planning, set-up, education, orientation, and assistance.

Center (GCMC) from completing the installation with the designated CAI targets this quarter. The contracts required to execute with CAI targets continue to present delays as the legal departments of the CAI often requests modifications or a complete rewrite of the agreement. Through testing of equipment placed at CAI's, GCMC was able to identify that two of their CAI targets had inadequate internet speeds that would not allow video transmittal. The turn around time on equipment and supply orders has created challenges. IH-DM did not encounter any additional challenges this quarter.

1. Please describe significant project accomplishments planned for completion during the next quarter (600 words or less).

Guthrie County Hospital hopes to start offering a Neurology Telemedicine Clinic. We are continuing to work on other clinics to set up and get staff familar with the equipment. Greene County Medical Center (GCMC) will begin training their health care providers on the use of telehealth equipment and protocols. The telehealth R.N. will begin planning and coordinating specialty clinics with the network of providers. GCMC will continue to pursue the required contractual agreements with the CAI targets so they can be linked to our network and deliver telehealth. Clarke County will continue to conduct planning activities related to the implementation of a several new specialty clinics. These include: Vascular Surgery, Occupational Medicine, Emergency Medicine, Psychiatric Services, Pediatrics, Gynecology, Plastic Surgery. Planning for miscellaneous community agency activities will occur: Osceola Senior Services, Clarke Emergency Disaster, Iowa Alliance Ambulance. Implementation of telemedicine equipment at the Osceola campus of Southwest Community College (SWiCC) should be finalized, as well as implementation of Telepharmacy at Clarke County which is to occur on October 11, 2011. There are ongoing activities surrounding marketing and education of telemedicine to staff at Clarke County Hospital. Grundy Center Medical Hospital (GCMH) plans to continue outreach and implementation efforts with our local EMS crews in the next quarter. This will entail reaching out to members of six local EMS crews to discuss the opportunity to use the equipment for education and communication purposes. One potential obstacle we anticipate with a number of these groups is internet accessibility and performance at their facilities. The GCMH Information Technology (IT) staff will be researching various wireless configurations and other equipment options to utilize when we encounter internet speed and accessibility issues. GCMH will be testing the peripheral diagnostic accessories with the providers, and working with them to develop policies and procedures for providing telemedicine services at GCMH. GCMH also will begin working on curriculum and/or programming that we will offer to the school districts, and hope to have conducted several sessions by the end of the coming quarter. The newly created Telehealth Nurse position will begin in this quarter, and our plan is to dedicate time to orienting this individual to the grant, the video and diagnostic equipment, and to the clinical processes at GCMH. GCMH is projecting 16 new anchor institutions for the next quarter.
