7. Please describe how your Public Computer Center(s) promotes economic recovery in your area, such as through providing job training, access to job searches, online course offerings, certifications and the like (600 words or less).

Economic recovery in Maine is aided by our partnership with the Maine Department of Labor and coordination of efforts with our BTOP trainer and Career Center staff for courses offered in libraries related to job searching, crossover skills, using social media, interviewing skills, etc. Our subscription to LearningExpress Library and Popular Software tutorials offers an online component for job seekers to improve skills and learn additional skills on their own at libraries and at home. Career Center's promote the use of the product to increase skills as well as for resume writing, cover letters, etc. This online tool is available to job seekers in public libraries, in Career Centers and with a free login – from home. We partner with Adult Education in the state to also promote this tool for GED, SAT, GRE as well as for digital literacy skills. The Maine State Library has also created online courses delivered via Adobe Connect and available through new Digital Learning Portal. These courses include: What to do at a Job Fair, How to File for Unemployment in Maine, Interviewing Skills, How to Navigate Job & Employment Websites, etc. None of the online courses offered are included in the totals above. We are unable to track usage on time spent utilizing these Adobe Connect online courses but we can see that they are being accessed. We now have 2487 registered LearningExpress Library users who have or are now taking XXX courses.

Communication with the PCCs and partners is a vital to ongoing success of our project. Each opportunity with an existing partner has introduced new organizations and agencies we can partner with on projects. Libraries are reaching out to their communities and to partners for other projects. It is important to continue conversations, speak about the project in all possible venues, and offer support to both partners and PCCs. The Maine State Library strives to serve as a model for the public libraries in our state but learns from the libraries and partners to go forward together. The Maine State Library will be presenting at the Maine Digital Government Summit about the work libraries are doing in areas of digital literacy and digital communications to build awareness about the important role libraries play in this arena so the Maine State Library can assist in building new partnerships with other agencies and organizations statewide.
