Thank you for your continuing efforts, and those of your staff, on the Broadband Technologies and Opportunities Program (BTOP). Many of my constituents are preparing their second round applications, and I would like to highlight several Alaska-specific concerns in the most recent Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA).

First, thank you for your strong commitment to Native Americans and Alaska Natives by both encouraging projects connecting the most underserved areas in the country, Indian Country, and by engaging in tribal consultation for those projects which particularly affect Native American and Alaska Native communities.

However, I must emphasize the unique nature of land holdings by Alaska Natives. The 1971 Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) settled land claims of Alaska Natives with a distribution of 44 million square acres of land and \$1 billion. Under ANCSA 12 regional corporations, one at-large regional corporation, and more than 200 village corporations were formed with the mission of generating profits to return to shareholders in the form of dividends. In addition, 12 regional non-profit organizations were formed to handle social service, job training, and other needs for their communities. These entities exist in addition to the 237 federally recognized tribes in Alaska. In keeping with your agency's commitment to tribal consultation, I strongly suggest it conduct a thorough consultation process that includes these groups impacted in Alaska.

Secondly, I applaud your effort to create community projects focusing on anchor institutions, especially community colleges. These institutions have a vital role in educating communities and providing job training for many. While nationwide, most

community colleges are independent from the traditional four-year university, Alaska's regional community campuses are consolidated into our university system. As you review project applications from Alaskans please take into consideration that our regional community campuses serve the same functions and duties as typical community colleges in the lower 48. We recommend the following language be used for guidance as the reviewers analyze applications.

DEFINITION OF COMMUNITY COLLEGE---the term community college means an institution of higher education as defined in Section 101(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S. C. 1001(a)) or that institution's affiliated campuses that

- 1. provide a 2 year program of instruction which leads to the award of an associate degree and;
- 2. primarily offers instruction leading to the award of an associate degree.

The regional community campuses in Alaska are widespread and assist Alaskans in the most remote areas of the state in obtaining training and educational services. The locations range from the Chukchi Campus located in the Northwest Arctic Borough to the Ketchikan Campus located in the southernmost part of Alaska.

Thank you for your time and consideration of these requests. I appreciate the work your agency has undertaken and I look forward to working with you and your staff in the future.
