Project was completed during the fourth quarter of 2013. All network construction was complete, as modified by a final AAR. Some CAIs added earlier in the year were removed due to excessive utility company make ready time frames. Some microwave sites were removed due to problems in obtaining legal rights. In total, 91 CAIs were connected to the network, and 13 microwave sites were completed. Close out activities are underway.

During the past quarter, completion of the "additional CAIs" approved earlier in 2013 became challenged by utility company make ready. Of the planned 34 additional CAIs, 20 were completed. The balance of the additional CAIs, as well as one of the original CAIs, were removed from the project by an approved AAR. Additionally, obtaining permits and legal access to several of the microwave sites began to exceed the project timeline. Of the 15 microwave sites planned in the project, 13 were completed. Equipment for the remaining two sites was procured and OpenCape is working to complete the installation of these sites using non-grant funding.

100% of grant funds were obligated through the end of 2013. Close out activities will continue into 2014 without further grant funding.
