Ronan Telephone Company already has non-discrimination and network management policies in place and Montana West will be modifying these policies to accommodate the additional requirements necessary for the provision of service to other providers. These policies will be in place before the network is finished and service is offered. We anticipate standard traffic prioritization allowing for virtual private networking, some dark fiber sales, and priority given to voice service when it becomes available. We have not blocked consumers from any lawful content or prevented any consumers from attaching any legal device to the network and do not intend to do so when the network is turned up.
