Interconnection Agreements (600 words or less)

EAGLE-Net currently has eighteen service agreements with wholesale and last mile providers to whom it is providing service. We have 29 signed Master Service Agreements that provide the framework for future service agreements, and we are in current negotiations with another 17 providers for future agreements. No requests for interconnection have been denied. Now that we have a network operator actively marketing for wholesale agreements, and as the network has grown and is being completed, there is an increased awareness by other providers of the opportunities available with the EAGLE-Net network throughout Colorado.

Peering and Transit Agreements (600 words or less)

EAGLE-Net currently has service agreements with eight providers from whom it is purchasing peering and transit services. No other agreements are currently being negotiated to obtain additional transit services.

Three subscribers dropped EAGLE-Net service in 2014. Two of these were both school districts that received lower bids for services based on their e-Rate 470 requisitions. In one instance, EAGLE-Net was using a third-party circuit to provide service and we could not provide a lower bid to compete. In the other instance, we were simply underbid by a larger provider. The third was a school district using EAGLE-Net as a secondary provider for a special project. The project ended, so they stopped purchasing the service. These three CAIs represented a 4.3% loss of our total customers.
